



Adaptive optics (AO) is a technique that corrects in real time for image distortions caused by motions in the Earth' s atmosphere. The Big Bear Solar Observatory (BBSO) New Solar Telescope (NST) depends on a state-of-the-art adaptive optics (AO) system to enable diffraction-limited imaging (0.08 arcseconds in the visible). The current NST AO incorporates a Shack-Hartmann lenslet array with 308 subapertures for measuring wavefront error. The wavefront distortion is then corrected using a deformable mirror (DM) with 357 piezoelectric actuators.

AO systems, such as AO-308 can deliver diffraction-limited images over a relatively small angle on the sky known as the isoplanatic patch. Image quality gradually deteriorates with increasing angle from the patch. The size of the patch varies with seeing conditions.
